With a rapidly growing population and an increasing need for space for shelter pets, the Cape Coral Animal Shelter and Veterinary Clinic broke ground for "Phase II" construction.

The Lee County Sheriff's Office Animal Cruelty Task Force was on-hand for the pivotal and momentous event as dignitaries dug their shovels into the dirt to signify the start of this remarkable project.



Phase II will more than triple the existing space and offer amenities such as a community room and space for dog training.

Currently working with an undersized facility, the shelter has done miraculous work here in our county. The new 19,000 square foot facility will be nothing short of a blessing for our county's animal community.

Serving the Lee County community since 2013, K9 Eli has been a partner, a protector and a friend to all of us at the Lee County Sheriff's Office.

His faithful nature and work ethic made him an asset to our agency; his devotion to his handler made him our buddy.

Few understand the volume and difficulty of the training undertaken by law-enforcement K9s and their handlers.

Their abilities are remarkable, as are their contributions. We love them, as one would love family, and depend on them, as coworkers, under the most difficult and stressful circumstances.

Eli was a fast learner and a diligent worker. These traits made him an incredible K9 officer.

He played a key role in the work done by our agency assisting in the apprehension of 103 suspects and participating in over 200 narcotics searches.

In 2019, Eli retired and remained with his handler. A loving family member, he enjoyed the care, love and attention that he received.

On February 26, 2025, the Lee County Sheriff's Office was forced to say goodbye to our family member, Eli, as he passed peacefully.

Eli will never be forgotten and his work, on behalf of our community, will be appreciated and remembered forever.





BRUSHING YOUR DOG'S TEETH: SOME THOUGHTS

Much like trimming your dog's nails, tooth brushing is no easy task.

Brushing, however, reduces plaque buildup and, in most cases, prevents tooth decay, infections and/or painful gum disease.

Prior to beginning, please be advised that there are toothbrushes specifically made for canine use. These brushes have a specially-angled head and soft bristles. If your dog will not allow you to use a brush, finger brushes may be your best approach.

Additionally, there are canine toothpastes that are meat, poultry and/or peanut butter flavored. DO NOT USE HUMAN TOOTHPASTE AS IT WILL LIKELY HAVE DETRIMENTAL EFFECTS ON YOUR DOG'S DISGESTIVE SYSTEM.

Keep a handful of your dog's favorite treats in your pocket. Small, crunchy treats are recommended. Be prepared to



reward him/her for cooperating.

Choosing a location is important. As brushing is a foreign activity to dogs, it is helpful to find a relaxing and comfortable location to reduce your dog's anxiety. Do not hold them down, hover over them or tether them when attempting to brush their teeth. This will prove to be traumatic and make brushing nearly impossible.

With a dab of the canine toothpaste on your finger, gently touch your finger to their gums. This ensures that your dog will allow you access to his/her teeth and will prepare them for the taste of the toothpaste.

Speaking in low, friendly tones will reassure your pet that all is well

and likely help your dog to remain calm.

Once this has been accomplished, apply a small amount of the paste to the toothbrush and begin to gently brush at a 45-degree angle. By angling the brush, you will ensure that plaque is removed at the gum line.

Reward when finished!

If daily brushing is impossible, you will find that periodic brushing is helpful. Try several days a week or as often as Fido allows!


